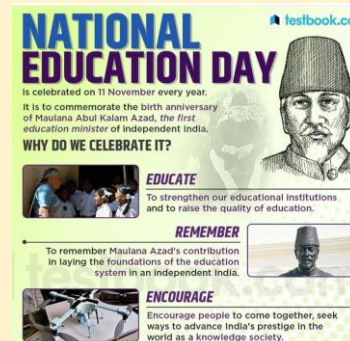

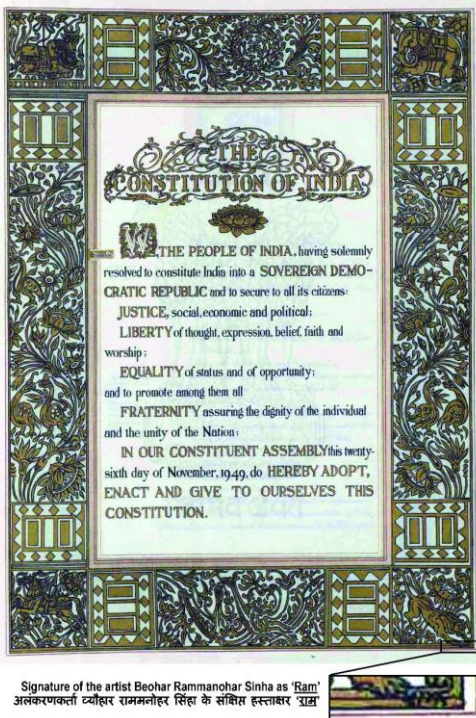

26th November: Constitution Day

Constitution Day, is celebrated in India on 26 November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. On 26 November 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India, and it came into effect on 26 January 1950. It is the longest written Constitution in the world containing 395 Articles, 22 Parts and 12 Schedules. The Constitution of India was not typeset or printed but was handwritten and calligraphic in both English and Hindi. It was entirely handcrafted by the artists of Shantiniketan under the guidance of Acharya Nandalal Bose, with the calligraphy texts done by Prem Behari Narain Raizada in Delhi.



14th November: Children's Day

India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru once said, "The children of today will make the India of tomorrow. The way we bring them up will determine the future of the country". Every year, Children's Day is celebrated all across India on November 14, the birthday of Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru. He was a great advocate for children's right and for an all-inclusive education system where knowledge is accessible to all.

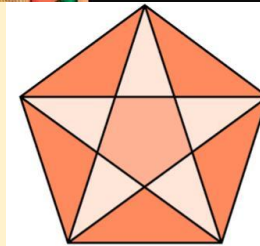
