

Smith Talent Search Examination Prize Distribution







Gita Gopinath is the Deputy Managing Director, International Monetary Fund (IMF).




6. Madhabi Puri Buch


• Every year on March 30, people around the world celebrate the International Day of Zero Waste, a day designated by the United Nations General Assembly to promote reducing waste and sustainable consumption and production patterns. This day promotes the creation of a more sustainable and waste-free world.

• Scientists from the Australian Museum Research Institute, the University of Sydney, and the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory have identified a new species of the genus Nemateleotris. The lavender blushed dartfish, or Nemateleotris lavandula, was discovered in the western and central Pacific Ocean.



• The National Dairy Research Institute (NDRI) in Karnal, Haryana, has produced the country's first cloned female calf of the desi breed Gir, named 'Ganga'. The NDRI had initiated a project to clone indigenous cow breeds such as Gir and Sahiwal to increase milk production. Gir, Sahiwal, Tharparkar, and Red-Sindhi are indigenous cattle breeds in India.

• A team of researchers from the Museo Nacional de Ciencias Naturales in Madrid, Spain, has described a new species of deer, Dama celiiae, from fossils found in the Manzanares valley.



• The BrahMos missile is a type of supersonic cruise missile that can be launched from various platforms aeroplanes, or land. It is currently the fastest supersonic missile in the world and was developed by a partnership between India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Russia's NPO Mashinostroyeniya, forming BrahMos Aerospace.
